STRAND STREET ALMOST OFF-LIMITS

Construction to revamp all the shop fronts and areas along Strand Street is now in full swing. All the tenants are out and most of the pavement is now hoarded-off from the Adderley Street end up and to the Parade Concourse area.

The Internal brickwork and shop fronts have all been demolished and trains of trucks are busy carting away all the

rubble. Services are being installed and the superstructure reworked to the architect's brand new specifications.

From the SAPS up and to the end of Strand Street the Staircase access to the Station Deck has been demolished to make way for TWO new stair ways, so access is limited for now. Please access the Deck from inside the station complex.



KNUCKLE BUILDING

Superstructure façade of the Knuckle Building is now completely demolished to make way for a brand new building here. This will be one of the first areas that will be brought on stream and will accommodate a whole new set of services and trading areas.

FOOD COURT



Similarly a whole new food court will rise from the dust and destruction is on the Old Marine Drive side of the City Concourse next to the new Ticket office across the Shozaloza Meyl entrance. The brickwork of the superstructure is almost complete and the first plumbing fixtures are being put in place.

TRAVEL CITY

Access to the old long distant bus zone is totally impeded as construction only permits the buses to enter this area so access is limited . Trenches have been dug and the pavement has been removed completely. Construction has commenced on the second food court area and new ticket offices in the City Concourse and where Intersite used to park a new building, called the glass box. The "Glass box" will be used to accommodate tenants that have to be re-located temporarily while their permanent spaces are being prepared by the contractor. In the long term it is envisaged that it will be part of the Creative Cape Town Space.
