

WORLD CUP SIGNAGE

FIFA TICKETING CENTRE

There are two ticketing centres: one at **Cape Town Airport** and another at **Spearhead**.

You will need to bring with you the credit card with which you paid for your tickets and we also advise you bring your passport should there be any issues with the machines.

If you are a member of *englandfans* and purchased your tickets through the FA, representatives will be on hand in each city to deal with any ticketing problems. Representatives of *englandfans* will be located at the Information Centre, V & A Waterfront Complex. The Information Centre is situated on Dock Road, (ex-Krall Gallery, also known as the Rocket Shed) next to the Ferryman's Tavern. Representatives will be there on Thursday 17th June - 11.00am to 2.00pm and Friday 18th June from midday to 4.00pm

FAN PARKS

If you're not going to the game, then there will be one Fan Park and 3 dedicated viewing areas - **The Grand Parade** at the front of the Cape Town City Hall will be where the main Fan Park will be situated with the dramatic Table Top Mountain in the background.

Three smaller Fan Parks will be located in the **Belville Velodrome**, **Athlone Stadium** and at **Swartklip Sports Complex**.

Fan Parks will also be set up in the Western Cape, locations still to be decided.

MATCHDAY TRANSPORT FOR DISABLED SUPPORTERS

A designated shuttle bus will operate between the main Transport Hub in the town centre and the stadium. This shuttle will take wheelchair ticket holders to the stadium. Ambulant disabled supporters will need a medical certificate or letter from your doctor stating your disability to be allowed to travel on the bus.

Pre-registration is essential and the process is currently being finalised. We will inform you of how to register once everything has been put in place. Each applicant will be allowed one carer to travel with them.

You will no doubt see the following WC transport information signs in the Host Cities and around the WC Stadium areas during the tournament:



Shuttle Stop Sign

The Shuttle Stop Sign is one to look out for at all International Airports where you will find the Special Bus Service Shuttles to the Host Cities and Stadiums



Park and Ride Sign:

The Park and Ride Sign indicates that you will park your car, bus, taxi, bicycle and be given a ride to the stadium



2010 FIFA World Cup Stadium Sign

This is the FIFA 2010 World Cup TM Sign, which indicates that you are in an accredited 2010 FIFA World Cup Stadium



To the Match Stadium Sign

This sign directs you to the Match Stadiums



Park and Walk Sign:

This sign directs you where you can park your car and walk to the stadium



Park and Ride Colour Coding Sign

This sign shows all the colour coding for stadium block parking areas and specific groups of people and ticket holders



Vehicle Routes Sign

This sign applies only for buses and freight vehicles



Route to Stadium Precinct Sign

This sign directs you on a route to the Stadium Precinct



Rail Station Park and Ride Sign

This sign directs you to where you park your car and get on a train to and from the stadium.
